## 3 Splash Pad

With no standing water, the incorporation of a splash pad is a great addition to the park offering a relatively safe and easy play option with the inclusion of water to cool down users and provide more features within the Park to attract users. Splash pads generally engage people of all ages and encourage interactive play allowing the community more opportunities to unite and come together.

## 2 Flexible Greenspace

Maintaining open lawn spaces within the Park allows for these spaces to be programmed for youth sports, as well as, provide users flexible unprogrammed open space for relaxing, reading, playing pick up sports, and picnicking at other times supporting both active and passive recreation. These flexible greenspaces also allow for the staging of public events and festivals providing the City with many opportunities for programming within the Park.

## 8 Picnic Area

Provide a shaded area(s) with picnic tables, benches, and trash receptacles offering users a place to sit, relax, eat, play games, and rest within the Park. Located near the refurbished gazebo, new pavilion, playground, and natural play nodes to support overlapping compatible uses within the Park.

## 1 6' Wide Walking Path

Provide accessible walking paths for all users. The walking path system is a series of overlapping loops providing opportunities for passive recreation as well as pedestrian circulation.

## 10 Rain Garden

Incorporate green infrastructure solutions, including rain gardens to collect rain water and reduce runoff. A rain garden is a depressed area in the Park that collects water allowing it to soak into the ground at specific locations. These can be planted with grasses and flowering perennials making beautiful gardens that also serve as stormwater management.

**1 Inclusive Playground**
